Counselling Services

Healing from Abuse and Trauma Services

Provide individualized and group counselling to women who have experienced childhood and/or adult physical and emotional abuse resulting in trauma.

Reintegration Counselling Services

Provide one-to-one and group counselling for women on provincial probation and parole using a harm reduction framework.

Community General Counselling Services

Provide counselling to women in the community dealing with a broad range of social, economic and justice disadvantages.

Psychiatric Services

For our clients who need more in-depth and ongoing support. By internal referral only.

Partner Abuse Response (PAR)

A court-mandated 12-session education and counselling program for women charged with domestic violence. Participants examine their beliefs and attitudes toward domestic abuse and learn non-abusive ways of resolving conflict. The service fee is based on income on a pro-rated sliding scale. Cultural interpreters are available at no cost.

Parenting Services

Offer support to mothers reuniting with their families post or during incarceration. The goal is to develop strong and responsive parenting skills.

Phyllis Haslam Residence

For women paroled from federal and provincial correctional facilities.

A transitional residence where women work towards community integration in a supportive and structured environment.

Sex Work Transition Program

Exit Doors Here

Provides personalized wrap around services and interventions for women wishing to exit the sex trade industry. The program uses a new evidence-based case management model called Critical Time Intervention (CTI), which has proven success in transitioning people from precarious and sensitive situations to stability.

Employment Services

Building Employment Strategies Together (BEST)

Provides one-on-one and group support to develop a job seeking plan including building communication skills, resume development, financial literacy training, identifying career training programs, and job placement.

Record Suspension Information Services

Provide free one-on-one assistance with submitting a pardons application to the National Parole Board of Canada.

My Start-Up

In partnership with Rise Asset Development at University of Toronto, this is a women's self-employment training program including access to a low-interest business loan.

College Park Court Services

Direct Accountability

Provides alternatives to prosecution for people charged with minor criminal offences.

Court Support

Volunteers provide assistance to women navigating court.

Remand Project

To avoid remand orders, we provide support and referrals to women and advocate on their behalf.

Outreach and Community Engagement

Marketplace

Provides free clothing and personal care items to Elizabeth Fry clients and the community.

Social-Recreational Program — Vanier Centre for Women

Twice a month, volunteers provide social supports and organize recreational events for women in Vanier.
